

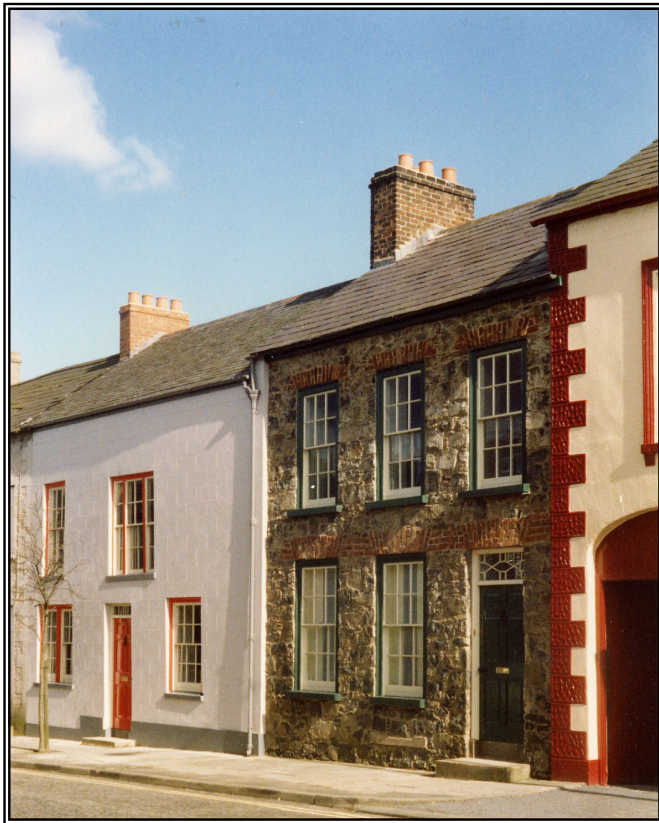
THE ARCHITECTURAL HERITAGE FUND

Northern Ireland

For 25 years the Architectural Heritage Fund has helped voluntary organisations regenerate historic buildings, creating community and education facilities, workspace and homes. This has often been a catalyst for further regeneration. We have supported relevant voluntary groups with grants, loans and advice on more than 700 projects to date. This is an example:

Housing regeneration in the village of Moira, Northern Ireland



The whole of one end of the village of Moira was virtually derelict when Hearth showed an interest in three terraced houses originally built in the 1780s. Great effort was made to incorporate the fragments of the original fittings wherever possible in the refurbishment. Once they had restored them and returned them to residential use, interest appeared in all others in the area, which are all now inhabited. The project was therefore instrumental in regenerating this part of the village and has renewed the sense of community within it.
